
Commercial Drivers License Drug and Alcohol Training 49 CFR, Part 382.601(b) Learner Outcomes

At the end of each training session, the attendee will:

1. Be able to identify the company's Designated Employer Representative(s) (DER).
2. Learn testing procedures, including information regarding the integrity of the testing process, safeguarding the validity of the test results, and getting correct results
3. Become aware of the categories of which drivers are subject to testing and circumstances under which a driver will be tested.
4. Identify when the driver is required to be in compliance.
5. Know what constitutes and refusal to test and what conduct is prohibited to the driver.
6. Understand the consequences of failing a drug or alcohol test (for alcohol, both levels of violation)
7. Become aware of the effects of alcohol and controlled substances, including signs and symptoms of a problem.
8. Information concerning referral and recovery services.

In addition, an employer will receive Certificates of Receipt signed by the driver and trainer.
